Four Legislative Purposes

- Respond to the Public Health Emergency & Negative Economic Impacts
- Revenue Recovery for Public Sector Entities
- Premium Pay for Essential Workers
- Water/Sewer/Broadband Infrastructure



One US Dept. of Treasury Goal

 Consideration for the disproportionate impacts of the COVID-19 public health emergency on those hardest-hit by the pandemic, especially low-income families and communities of color.



Forbidden Uses

- Pension Funds
- Reduction in Tax Revenue
- Debt Service or Financial Reserves



Funding Eligibility

• March 11, 2021 to December 31, 2024

Two Tranches: ½ in 2021, ½ in 2022




Eligibility Considerations

- Does the proposal combat the current pandemic or avoid/mitigate future pandemic conditions?
- Does the proposal address the negative economic impacts of the pandemic?
- Does the proposal promote equity within the community and target significantly impacted communities?
- Is the proposal located within or for the benefit of residents of Qualified Census Tracts (QCTs)?




Qualified Census Tracts (QCTs)

Other Funds for Strategic Consideration

- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) City of Worcester applying for ~\$2.5M to date for direct pandemic activities.
- Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) City of Worcester received \$16,341,767
- CARES Act Entitlement Programs CDBG, HOME, ESG, etc.
- Worcester Public Schools \$130,431,488 (CARES Act, ESSER)
- State ARPA Funds \$8.7B
- Federal Build America Act of 2021 \$1T
